As you work towards completing your leadership placement within the Windsor Family of Schools, you will be responsible for submitting three reflections commenting on your experiences. You can either **email** your reflections, or hand them in on the due date in class.

Treat each reflection as a written journal or response that chronicles your time at the placement. They should be at least **one page double-spaced**, answered using full sentences, correct spelling and grammar, and answer or comment on the following questions or ideas:

## Reflection #1: Due to Ms. Wood on or before Monday Feb. 1st

- What does it mean to you to be a leader?
- What does being an "effective" or "successful" leader mean to you?
- Think of someone you admire (a role model). What qualities do you admire about this person(s)? How can you develop these qualities?
- What do you like the most about your leadership placement so far? What do you like the least?
- What do you anticipate being the most common sources of stress in the particular leadership role you will be taking on?
- What strategies do you plan to use to cope with these sources of stress?

## Reflection #2: Due to Ms. Wood on or before Monday Feb. 15th

- What ethical or moral issues do you anticipate encountering in your leadership role? How well prepared do you think you are for dealing with these issues?
- What does being fair mean to you? And how do your actions back up that belief?
- What does it mean to be a team player? Do you fit your own definition?
- In terms of your placement, what were you most proud of recently?
- What gifts and talents do you bring to your role as leader?
- What difficulties or challenges have you faced so far as a leader? How did you overcome them?

## Reflection #3: Due to Ms. Wood on or before Wednesday March 2<sup>nd</sup>

- What has been the biggest test of your leadership ability? What have you learned as a result of this challenge?
- As a leader, how do you confront issues of "injustice"? When do you? When do you not?
- How do you handle it when you've done something wrong?
- In terms of being a leader, what risks have you taken recently? How did they turn out? What did you learn about yourself by taking the risk?
- Having completed your placement, would you take on this role again? Is there anything you would change?
- Was there any one experience you had that you could narrow down as the most valuable during your placement?
- How are your leadership skills best being used today? How will they best be used in the future?
